Polyrhythms Tinka Bechert

German-Irish painter Tinka Bechert's show brings together painting, sculpture and textile works made since 2018. The exhibition centres on a decisive shift in Bechert's practice away from narrative imagery toward abstraction. Bealtaine Open Studio Event

Model studio artists Kate McDonagh, Andy Parsons and Jo Conway will open their studios to the public, offering a rare behind-the-scenes insight into their creative processes. This is a drop-in event, so no pre-booking is necessary.

Kate McDonagh is an abstract artist exploring contrasts of light and dark, stillness and movement. Influenced by time spent in Japan, her practice centres on water-based woodblock printing (Mokuhanga) and watercolour, with carved blocks evolving into sculptural works.

Jo Conway is a visual artist with a background in theatre design, combines drawing, collage, textiles and mapping to explore family, chaos and human experience, inspired by ancient Egyptian and early Romanesque art.

Sligo Arts Service's Arts + Health programme is focussed on service users, residents, staff and family in both day and residential care settings throughout County Sligo. It is funded by Sligo County Council and The Arts Council of Ireland.

Folk:Lure Residency Programme

Artists Miriam Needham & Medbh Gillard are Sligo Arts Services artists in residence in Daycare facilities as part of "Folk:Lure" Arts + Health initiative. Throughout the months of April & May, the artists are working at centres in both Collooney and Easkey with service users. Miriam Needham's residency involves storytelling and creative writing, while visual artist Medbh Gillard is exploring themes of memory and place with the participants.

Artist Maria Ward will lead chair-based drumming sessions for service users at Copper Beech in Cloonamahon. Using weighted drumsticks, participants will be encouraged to follow simple rhythmic movements to pre-recorded music, focusing on striking the beat rather than playing instruments. The sessions are designed to be fun, inclusive, and celebrate a shared lust for life, with music chosen to match the group's preferences.

Memories Old & Memories New with David Lawless & Margaret Byrne

Relaxed music and singing sessions designed for care home residents. Using harp, guitar, whistles, voice and percussion, David and Margaret's sessions will include gentle movement and simple percussive elements. Familiar ballads and traditional songs will be used to encourage reminiscence, connection and shared enjoyment.
